

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

WINTERS CEMETERY DISTRICT

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730) which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code. After public notice and hearing it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix designated officials and employees and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the Conflict-of-Interest Code of the **WINTERS CEMETERY DISTRICT (District)**.

Designated employees shall file their statements with the **District** which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction. (Gov. Code Section 81008). Statements for all designated employees will be retained by the **District**.

APPENDIX A

PART I – DESIGNATED EMPLOYEES

<u>Position</u>	<u>Disclosure Category</u>
District Manager	1
Consultants & New Positions	*

*Consultants/new positions shall be included in the list of designated positions and shall disclose pursuant to the broadest disclosure category in the code subject to the following limitation:

The Manager of the District may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a “designated position,” is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with disclosure requirements described in this section. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant’s or new position’s duties, and based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Manager of the District’s determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code.

The following positions are NOT covered by the conflict-of-interest code because they must file under Government Code Section 87200 and, therefore, are listed for informational purposes only:

Board Members

An individual holding one of the above listed positions may contact the Fair Political Practices Commission for assistance or written advice regarding their filing obligations if they believe that their position has been categorized incorrectly. The Fair Political Practices Commission makes the final determination whether a position is covered by Government Code Section 87200.

PART II - DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

1. Interest in real property located within the jurisdiction including property located within a two-mile radius of any property owned or used by the District.

Investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the District.
